


# Digital Equity (Wisconsin)

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Tool Search: Digital Equity

The Digital Equity tool allows schools to track digital devices and internet availability for students. More than one record can be added, but records cannot overlap.

## Digital Equity Field Descriptions

The following fields are available in the Digital Equity Detail editor. Fields with an asterisk and in red text are required entry.

## Start Date

Indicates the date the student began participation in the program.

Records cannot overlap.

## End Date

Indicates the date the student ended participation in the program.

## Barrier to Internet Access in Residence

Lists the reasons why a student is unable to access internet in their primary residence.

Indicates the student has access to the internet at the student's place of learning, usually the student's residence.
