Campus Learning includes the following existing and new tools for teachers. We're always working on new features!

Curriculum Options

Use <u>Folders</u> to arrange curriculum. Create <u>Resources</u>, like assignments that are not scored, to distribute lesson materials, a syllabus, or any other instructional content that doesn't fit an "assignment." Use the <u>Curriculum Library</u> to share curriculum with other teachers in your district and find curriculum they've shared to add to your sections.

Progress Monitor

The <u>Progress Monitor</u> allows teachers in standards-based classrooms to view students' proficiency at a glance and easily manage assignments across all standards in a section.

Planner

View your <u>curriculum</u> and <u>schedule</u> in a calendar format, as well as the <u>curriculum</u> and <u>schedules</u> of other teachers.

Connect to Other Programs

Advanced Assignment Tools

Additional assignment features include:

- <u>Individualize</u> assignment Start and End Dates by student.
- Create <u>Scoring Rubrics</u> to evaluate student work.
- Use the <u>Summary and Notes</u> text fields to provide additional information to students, or just to other teachers viewing the assignment.
- Attach Content Attach additional learning content to the assignment. The options available in this area are dependent on what your district has enabled.
- Distribute online <u>Discussions</u> from an assignment.
- Depending on district setup, allows students to <u>submit work</u> through Campus Student.
- Submit work on behalf of a student.

Quizzes

Create <u>quizzes</u> that are customized to your class's needs using a variety of <u>question</u> <u>types</u> and other features. Use <u>Quiz Settings</u> to allow retakes, organize questions into <u>pages</u> to simplify a student's experience, and <u>print quizzes</u> for students who need a



When enabled by your district, integrations connect other programs to Campus.

Depending on the type of connection, you can:

- Link <u>resources</u> in another program to assignments,
- <u>Receive</u> assignments and scores from another program,
- Attach <u>Google Drive files</u> to assignments,
- Allow students to launch another program via <u>Learning Tools</u>.

When it comes time to score the quiz, icons and sort options help you focus on which answers need your attention and provide feedback as needed. For students using paper quizzes, submit answers on their behalf.

Score Analysis

The <u>Score Analysis</u> tool allows teachers to view a distribution of student scores on assignments and visually break down how each student scored.

Communication

At the section level, use the <u>Section Feed</u> to communicate between teachers and students.

Use <u>Groups</u> tool to communicate with wider groups that can include staff, students, and parents/guardians. <u>Group Owners</u> can create groups for shared clubs, organizations, events, and interests and enable various levels of one-way and two-way communication.
